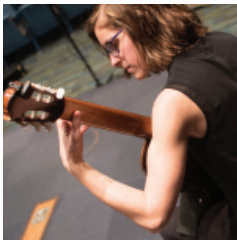

Faculty Highlights

Berlinski Named New McDonough Museum of Art Coordinator

Claudia Berlinski has taught at YSU for 18 years and has served within the Department of Art as an Assistant Professor, Foundation Program Coordinator, and Assistant to the Chair. In July of 2018, Professor Berlinski accepted the role of Museum Coordinator at the McDonough Museum of Art. This new position means that she will teach fewer classes in her Drawing and 2-D Foundations fields and will step away from the Assistant to the Chair and Foundations Program Coordinator positions. Professor Berlinski is a native of Buffalo, NY, where she earned her BFA in Printmaking from Buffalo State College. She has lived in Ohio for 30 years since she traveled here to attend graduate school at The Ohio State University, where she earned her MFA.

In addition to her responsibilities at the University, Professor Berlinski exhibits regionally and nationally, contributes to print portfolio exchanges, and has curated and adjudicated group exhibitions. Her work is included in several private and public collections nationwide. She previously curated the Thomases Family Endowment Gallery at the Jewish Community Center of Greater Youngstown.

As reflected in the McDonough's new mission statement, Professor Berlinski will continue to enhance the collaboration between the McDonough Museum of Art and the Department of Art and Cliffe College. We are excited about Professor Berlinski's vision and leadership and anticipate increased programming and further collaborations at YSU, within the community, and throughout the region.

Faculty Highlights

Art Historian Speaks at Conference in Japan

Dr. Johnathan A. Farris, Assistant Professor of Art History, recently presented a paper, “Contingency and Opportunity: The First Century of Hong Kong’s Public Parks,” at the 2018 International Planning History Conference in Yokohama, Japan. The paper was also published as part of the conference proceedings. In the essay, Dr. Farris examines public parks that were established between the 1840s and the 1940s, discussing how some flourished and others were compromised in densely populated and laissez-faire port cities that were situated between mountains and the sea.

Dr. Farris’s scholarship, including his 2016 book, *Enclave to Urbanity: Canton, Foreigners, and Architecture from the Late Nineteenth to the Early Twentieth Centuries* (Hong Kong University Press), has often focused on issues of cross-cultural exchange, particularly in the architecture of Chinese port cities.

Since joining the Department of Art faculty in fall 2017, Dr. Farris has offered courses in Chinese and 19th century art, art and the garden, and Survey of Art History from the Renaissance to the Present. This spring, he is also teaching a course on South and Southeast Asian art.

Before joining the YSU faculty, Dr. Farris lived and taught in Hong Kong for seven years. He now lives on Youngstown’s North Side near Crandall Park.

Student Highlights



Study Abroad Trip to Glasgow, Scotland

This past July, the Department of Art hosted its inaugural summer study abroad program in Glasgow, Scotland. Over the course of a month, students worked under the instruction of Associate Professor **Joseph D'Uva** at the Glasgow Print Studio, an internationally-acclaimed studio facility and gallery located in the heart of Glasgow's City Centre. Students created their artwork alongside some of Great Britain's most prominent artists and master printers and studied various techniques in intaglio, relief printing, screen printing, and drawing.

Professor D'Uva also led weekly class excursions throughout the region, visiting exhibitions, museums, and significant landmarks, including trips to: Stirling Castle, Scottish National Gallery of Modern Art in Edinburgh, Glasgow Cathedral, Kelvingrove Art Gallery and Museum, Largs via steamship, and sites bordering Loch Lomond (Scottish Highlands). This trip is the first in a summer study abroad initiative that the Department of Art hopes to conduct biennially to expose students to the art, culture, history, and landscape of Scotland.



Alumni Spotlight

Dominic Lippillo earned his BFA in Studio Art from Youngstown State University in 2005 and his MFA in Photography from Ohio University in 2009. Lippillo joined the faculty at Mississippi State University in 2010, and he was promoted to the rank of Associate Professor of Photography with tenure in 2017.

His research questions the role of photography by making digitally constructed images that address notions of space versus place, memory, and experience. His work has been featured in publications such as *Don't Take Pictures*, *Mono Chroma*, *Exposure*, *Daily Serving*, and *The Eye of Photography* and is included in the permanent collections of The Museum of Photographic Art; The Museum of Fine Arts, Houston; The University of Alabama, Tuscaloosa; and the University of North Dakota.

Lippillo is a recipient of a South Arts Fellowship (2018), a Mississippi Arts Commission Visual Artist Fellowship (2016), an MSU College of Architecture, Art and Design Teaching Award (2016), and an MSU Faculty Research Award (2013).

During the fall 2018 semester, Professor Lippillo was on sabbatical and was an artist-in-residence at the I-Park foundation in East Haddam, CT. He has several upcoming solo exhibitions for his photography series, "Stories We Tell Ourselves," at Manifest Gallery, Cincinnati, OH; Orange Coast College, Costa Mesa, CA; and Amarillo College, Amarillo, TX. Some of Lippillo's work is currently on display through June at the Rose Marie Smith Gallery in Tod Hall outside of President Tressel's office.

Anne Flood, BFA '17

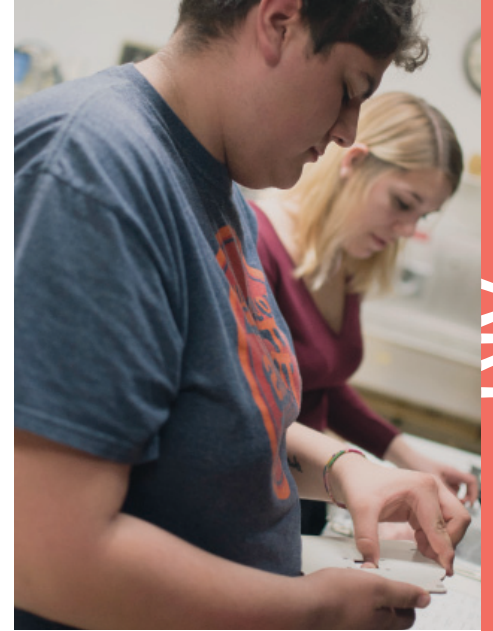
(August 19, 1988-November 24, 2017)

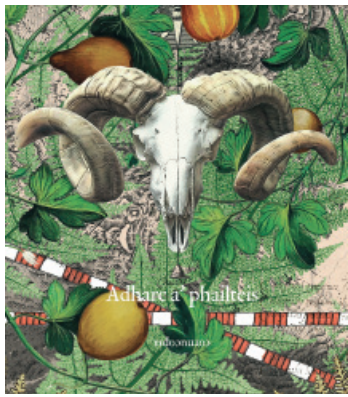

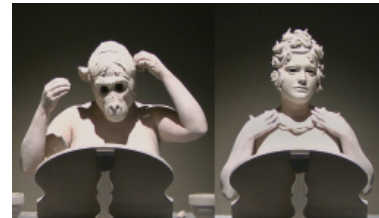

My journey to becoming a lecturer in Youngstown State's Department of Communication was an unusual one. Over the years, I have had the pleasure to work for several colleges and universities in northeast Ohio, usually on a part-time basis, including several years teaching at YSU. But it is the work that I have done as a sports media professional that brought me here in a full-time capacity to assist with YSU's flourishing sports broadcasting program.

Over my 30-plus-year career, I have worked on more sports media productions than I can remember: several Olympics broadcasts, more than 2,000 Cleveland Indians games (including several World Series games), hundreds of Cleveland Browns and Cleveland Cavaliers games, and many college football games, including YSU football broadcasts for ESPN. I deeply enjoy sharing those experiences with my students in the classroom and in the studio environment. My goal at YSU is to bring those experiences to our students, not only in the classroom, but by giving them access to opportunities to learn "hands-on" in some of the premier sports broadcasting facilities in Ohio through partnerships and internships with industry leaders.

YSU students earn top awards at state Communication meeting

During the fall semester, students in Youngstown State University's Department of Communication took home awards for the top graduate and top undergraduate student papers at the 2018 Ohio Communication Association (OCA) conference, which was held at the University of Akron's Wayne College.

Allison Centofanti and **Kaija DiPillo**, graduate students in the Professional Communication master's degree program, won for their paper, "Perception, Team Roles, and Cohesion in Student Groups."

The top undergraduate paper award went to **Jessica Cann**, **Sarah Demetruk**, **Joseph Anastasia** and **Christiana Savo** for their study, "So you think you can teach? A look into how negative evaluations impact university professors."

All papers submitted to the OCA for presentation at the annual conference go through a rigorous selection process involving communication scholars from across the state.

"The students worked really hard during the Spring 2018 semester to produce research papers that were high in quality and scholarly in scope," said **Dr. Jeff Tyus**, YSU associate professor of Communication Studies. "I couldn't be more proud of their accomplishments."

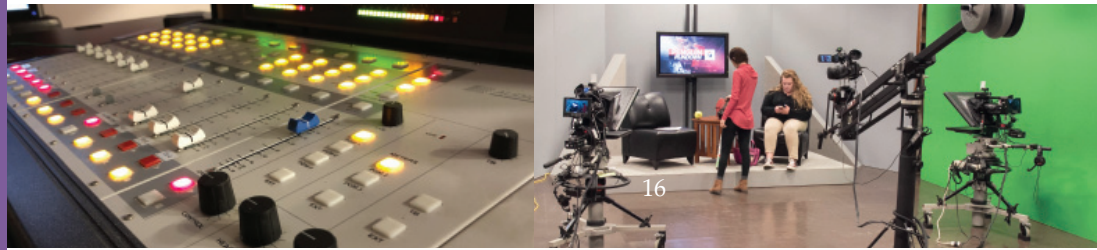

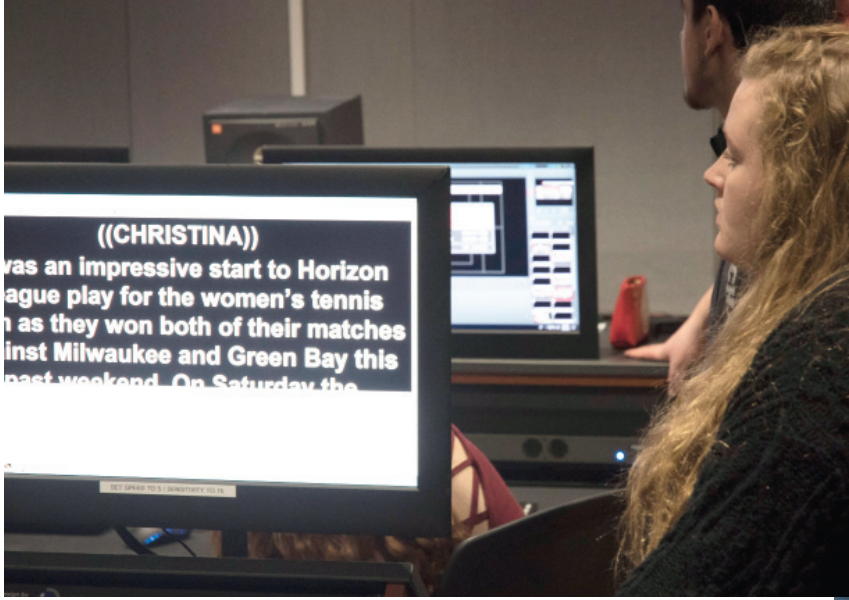

We honored Dr. Crist at the latter event for his decades of service to YSU, and **Dr. Andrew Mitchell** ushered in a new era of trombone excellence at Dana with his performance of William Goldstein's *Colloquy for Solo Trombone and Wind Symphony*.

Our students were also busy preparing for adjudicated auditions and performances. Professor of Voice, faculty member **Dr. Misook Yun** accompanied a group of students at this year's Ohio NATS auditions at Cedarville University, where undergraduate student **Rachel Jones** earned a third prize in the Second Year Women category, and graduate student **Lindsay Heavner** won second prize at the Advanced Women level. Last year, undergraduate student **Anna Murcko** won First Prize in the Junior Women category, and **Francesca Molinaro** (MM, 2018) earned a Second Prize in the Advanced Women category. In other vocal alumni news, **Victor Cardamone** (BME, 2017) recently won the Indiana Met Audition, and **Emily Alcorn** (BME, 2013) received the Washington National Opera Chorus Award.

The Youngstown Percussion Collective, featuring **Dr. Glenn Schaft**, alumnus **Ron Coulter** (MM, 2002) and Dana seniors **Anthony Tresky** and **Evan McCreary**, performed rare works by Lou Harrison and Franziska Boas at the 2018 Percussive Arts Society International Convention in Indianapolis.
