# MESSAGE FROM THE DEAN

During this challenging and unprecedented time, we hope your loved ones and you are healthy and well. As you know, the novel coronavirus, COVID-19, has thrust us all into unchartered territory awash with feelings of concern and uncertainty on many fronts. In the middle of the spring semester—in response to health guidelines and Governor DeWine's mandate—our faculty worked tirelessly to move all courses online in the span of two short weeks. This is a source of real pride for all of us, and I want to thank them and our students and staff for adjusting to that challenge and for rising to the moment with continued dedication to the exceptional education that distinguishes us.

In addition to their uninterrupted commitment to academic excellence, Cliffe College faculty, staff, and students sustained our mission of community engagement. We launched virtual visual and performing arts initiatives, such as Cliffe Creative Connections (C3) — A Place to See Virtual Any Kind of Art and the McDonough Museum of Art #museumchallenge and Gallery Talks. In addition, faculty created virtual performances with students in their courses, including Drs. Daniel Keown and Brandt Payne, Dr. Stephen Gage, and Dr. Maria Denison, and the McDonough staff created a special digital catalog featuring the work of 21 students graduating with their Bachelor of Fine Arts Degree from the Department of Art. As you may be aware, the Board of Trustees approved a resolution to make organizational adjustments related to the realignment of colleges and programs at their June board meeting. As a result, the Department of Communication joined the Williamson College of Business Administration, effective July 1, and we are now the Cliffe College of Creative Arts, inclusive of the Department of Art, the Dana School of Music, and the Department of Theatre & Dance.

Throughout the summer, our chairs, faculty, and staff made preparations for fall term. Deep concern for the health and safety of our students, colleagues, and community served as the foundation upon which we created plans for a safe return to campus. Utilizing protocols developed through the Office of Academic Affairs and guided by research upon which suggested best practices within their respective disciplines were based, each department engaged in extensive conversations and organization regarding the implementation of appropriate course delivery options for our fall semester. Although I suspect this period of uncertainty will remain for some time, I am optimistic that our resiliency will sustain us and our time of collective crisis will lead to innovation, new collaborations, and appreciation for everything that is good about each other.

This *Alumni Magazine* is full of news about faculty, students, staff, and alumni, and I hope you are inspired by our comings and goings. Professor Michelle Nelson is an expert in the field of typography with extensive experience in print design, identity systems, illustration, font creation, and book design. Her work may be found in the pages of the internationally recognized design magazine *Émigré*, and she has spoken at national conferences on the topic of typography, social activism, and design education. Professor Nelson's pedagogical approach to teaching introduction courses was part of the international publication entitled, *Taking a Line for a Walk: Assignments in Design Education*. The book is an international compendium of best practice in design education. *Taking a Line for a Walk* was derived from an exhibition on design education on display during the International Biennial of Graphic Design Brno.

Professor Nelson is a passionate educator who tirelessly updates the graphic + interactive design program to mirror the always changing design profession. When Youngstown State University took all their courses online for the final six weeks of the spring semester, Professor Nelson rose to the challenge. Students have regularly commented on the efficiency of her classes during this difficult transition to online education. Her desire to always go above and beyond to develop curriculum was the catalyst for an engaging and active online environment. Professor Nelson also recently participated in a week-long career webinar series through Mahoning County Educational Services center that will help students understand the evolving profession of Graphic Design. Many teachers used these webinars as a graded lesson for students and plan to incorporate the recorded videos in future lessons as well; over 550 students participated in the webinar series.

We have begun our 152nd year of musical study at the **Dana School of Music**, and we are delighted to welcome an extremely talented class of freshman students as well as those returning to continue their degrees. Preparations for the fall semester included our usual activities, such as purchasing music and equipment, bringing new students to campus, and welcoming back faculty and returning students. Of course, this year was somewhat different. COVID-19 added many more tasks to our fall preparation as we continue to provide an outstanding music education while mitigating the complexities of our current situation.

In this new environment, students will be spreading their music making throughout the campus and community. Many ensemble rehearsals will be held in large tents, parking garages, and even in historic **Stambaugh Auditorium**. By moving most of our academic courses online, we have created the space for applied lessons to occur in our classrooms and rehearsal spaces with proper social distancing.

**Morehshin Allahyari** is an artist, activist, writer, and educator. She was born and raised in Iran and moved to the United States in 2007. Her work deals with the political, social, and cultural contradictions we face every day. She thinks about technology as a philosophical toolset to reflect on objects and as a poetic means to document our personal and collective lives and struggles in the 21st century. Morehshin is the co-author of *The 3D Additivist Cookbook* in collaboration with writer/artist Daniel Bourke.

Morehshin has been part of numerous exhibitions, festivals, and workshops around the world including Venice Biennale di Archittectura, New Museum, The Whitney Museum of American Art, Pompidou Center, Museum of Contemporary Art in Montreal, Tate Modern, Queens Museum, Pori Museum, Powerhouse Museum, Dallas Museum of Art, and Museum für Angewandte Kunst. She has been an artist in residence at BANFF Centre (2013), Carnegie Mellon University's STUDIO for Creative Inquiry (2015), Autodesk Pier9 Workshop in San Francisco (2015), the Vilém Flusser Residency Program for Artistic Research in association with Transmediale, Berlin (2016), Eyebeam's one year Research Residency (2016-2017) in NYC, Pioneer Works (2018), and Harvest Works (2018). Her work has been featured in The New York Times, BBC, Huffington Post, Wired, National Public Radio, Parkett Art Magazine, Frieze, Rhizome, Hyperallergic, and Al Jazeera, among others.

She is the recipient of The Joan Mitchell Foundation Painters & Sculptors Grant (2019), The Sundance Institute New Frontier International Fellowship, and the leading global thinkers of 2016 award by Foreign Policy magazine. Her 3D Additivist Manifesto video is in the collection of San Francisco Museum of Modern Art, and recently she has been awarded major commissions by The Shed, Rhizome, New Museum, Whitney Museum of American Art, Liverpool Biennale, and FACT.
